1. Activities reflecting the Goals and Objectives of the Institution

Demow College was established long back in 1970. It has been working as the seat of higher learning in the region imparting higher education at undergraduate level with the objectives of bringing about improvement of the students generating in them the employable quality to fulfill the personal, social and national needs. While producing the graduates in Arts, the college functions with a countrywide outlook.

Through Partner Institution under Convergence Scheme of IGNOU, the college has committed to provide profession-oriented knowledge and skill to its students community.

The college has targeted its objectives of social change and development to be achieved through involvement of the college fraternity and the student community by organizing seminars for academic development, awareness programmes and popular talks for spreading of knowledge and NSS camps in the surrounding rural areas to orient the students devoting their labour for social benefit.

The institution also keeps its stake for upgrading the human values and cultures incorporating scientific outlook in holding outreach activities, games and sports, cultural events apart from classroom instruction. The college stands to maintain social harmony, eradication of communal conflicts and religious fanaticism by holding meetings and interaction with people at the affected areas of the region.

The college is tuning its academic activities of teaching and learning and other extracurricular performance of the students with national goals of higher education.

Development of infrastructural facility to meet the growing need of the institution, the challenges of time at best by effective teaching-learning process and encouraging the students to participate in quality improvement programmes are the visions of the college authority.

(i) Activities of NCC Wing:

The NCC wing of the college has persisted in fostering the sense of national integration amongst the students' community.

Pabitra Gogoi, Asstt. Prof. and CTO, NCC wing has participated in a ten days Civil Defence Training at National Civil Defence College, Nagpur.

Four cadets have participated in NIC camp held at Kakinada (Kerala) and Arunachal Pradesh, two cadets of the wing participated in Rock Climbing Camp at Madhya Pradesh and during the year fifteen cadets have obtained 'C' certificate and 40 cadets have got 'B' certificate. (ii) Activities of Partner Institution under the Convergence Scheme of IGNOU:

The earlier programmes under the Convergence Scheme of IGNOU have been continued. Additional 66 numbers of students have been enrolled under these programmes.

- ii. New programmes added under convergence scheme of IGNOU have been added (MLIS, CIT, BCA, B.Com, MPS, MES, MSO and BSW) and courses introduced earlier have been carried on.

3. Innovation in Curricular Design and Transaction

In Departmental Board of Studies meeting convened by the affiliating university, selective college teachers take part in curriculum design and preparation of syllabi.

Besides transaction of set curriculum designed in the university for Undergraduate Courses, the concerned departments usually hold a session of discussion informing the students about the suggested books of reading and courses.

4. Interdisciplinary Programmes Started

- i) In executing the programme of 'Environmental Studies' which fall in the domain of interdisciplinary course the faculty of different departments contribute by taking up the theoretical classes, field study and evaluating the project reports.
- ii) The faculty members of different departments extend their services for running up the courses under convergence scheme of IGNOU.

The institution follows the University guidelines as regards examination reforms and the regulations made by the University from time to time. The internal assessment system has been introduced following the instructions of the university in 1+1+1 system. While conducting the examination strict vigilance, systematic arrangement and record keeping system have been introduced.

The concerned departments follow the guidelines formulated by the Dibrugarh University as regards holding of unit test and preparation of internal assessment marks for degree level.

Accordingly, the principal takes necessary measure and suggests the incumbent teacher (s) to develop her/his teaching quality and appreciates those who are found to be sincere and up to the mark.

The HoDs of different departments are entrusted with the responsibility of assessing the students' progress and their response to the students' reaction. The HoDs and the faculty of the respective departments are asked about their opinion on the progress of their courses and the way of delivering their services to the students.

Leading personalities who are the guardians too are invited to the college from time to time for deliberations on academic and institutional development of the college and they extend their support in achieving the objectives.

Demow College maintains health awareness programmes from time to time. Demow Referral Hospital is situated at a distance of 300 meters from the Demow College and provision of 108 ambulance facility which is a govt. medical service, are at the doorstep, so such readily available facility are availed, if and when required.

33. Performance in sports activities

The college has provided the game facilities for the physical development of the students. Game facilities such as table tennis, badminton, handball, carom, volleyball and cricket are made available for the students.

The college authority encourages the student community to participate in various sports activities in and outside the state. Nonetheless, no competent sports person is found in this year.

For participation in inter-college tournaments, the college authority bears the expense. The college fraternity and the student community as a whole provide financial support to the outstanding sportspersons to participate in state level sports events and national level games.

36. Activities of the Guidance and Counseling Unit

The college career guidance and counseling unit run by a few faculty members arrange the career counseling programmes for the students. Students are specifically counseled to opt for courses according to their ability and affordability for the courses run by the college and for progression. At the beginning of a new academic session, the college authority together with the teaching staff holds the counseling sessions about the courses and course related matters.

Similar programmes are held in the college for outgoing students for their subsequent progression.

- (i) As a part of career counseling, 18 students have been sent to Sibsagar College, Joysagar to attend a workshop on environment and waste material uses on 8th October, 2010.
- (ii) Academic career counseling has been held for the TDC 1st year students (new entrants).
