The Demow College library achieved its separate identity after shifting it from an attached room to an Assam-typed building newly constructed with the aid of MP fund in the year 2000. The size of the library at its initial stage was not enough to render adequate services. Now, the size is growing up and the process of computerization has been done partially. Along with usual services, the library has been imparting knowledge in different areas to students through extension activities.

Updating of data entry work has been continued and it has been planned to expand the modernization of the library services by digitalizing pertinent documents.

23. Number of courses in which student assessment of teachers is introduced and the action taken on student feedback

The teachers hold departmental meetings from time to time to understand the problems of the students. Self-appraisals of the teachers are done. Students are generally assessed in their different academic and extracurricular aspects by the concerned teachers. The Principal monitors the performance of the teachers and suggests measures for remedying any academic issues raised by the students. For remedying difficulties of the students in comprehending the courses taught based on feedback the authority motivates the teachers, to equip with the new methods of teaching. Teachers are advised to attend Refresher Courses/Orientation Courses, Seminars and other academic activities.

On the basis of students' feedback, the following actions are taken-

Scholarship amount of Rs.1, 29,410/- has been released to the S/T students sanctioned by the Govt. of Assam. Free studentship for eight students amounting to Rs.22, 690/- has been sanctioned on the basis of merit.

Alumnae of the college are often invited to the college, by the college authority while seminars, workshops and other programmes are held in the college. The alumnae actively support the annual sports, freshmen social, conference, and popular talks and in extension works through their participation, discourse and financial help from time to time.

Parents/guardians are major players in the development of academic environment; and hence three guardian members have been incorporated into the college governing body in the absence of Parent-Teacher Association. The college has planned to form a Parent-Teacher Association.

Demow College maintains health awareness programmes from time to time. The programmes include blood-group testing, and cost free health check-up.

A HIV awareness programme has been held. Dr. Tayabur Rahman, Dy. Superintendent, Demow FRU with his team has acted as the resource person. Special programmes of health awareness on 'Diabetes-A Health Hazard' and 'Health, Nutrition and Cancer care' have been organized in the college campus.

College organized Blood Testing Camp in collaboration with Sibsagar district NCD cell under NRHM. A vaccination camp for encephalitis for students and staff of the college has been held.
